## **Recommended Books**

- "How to Brew" by John Palmer (BK415) How To Brew contains easily digested information for the first time brewer and technical information for the Master Brewer. This is the first book to include legitimate indepth information on all-grain brewing.
- "Designing Great Beer" by Ray Daniels (BK480) This book teaches you how to design recipes. The book starts out with in-depth information on malt, yeast, hops and how to choose the right ingredient for the beer you are making. Subsequent chapters follow up with information on beer styles.
- "Brewing Classic Styles" by Jamil Zainasheff and John Palmer (BK505) These two pair up to offer the homebrewing community the best recipe book available today. This book is the perfect source for great beer recipes. In this book you will find a recipe for every style of beer in the BJCP guidelines. Both Extract and All Grain recipes are available.
